### Monopoly Walk Option 4: The Ospringe Walk

Distance: 2.82km (1.75 miles)

Why not stretch your legs and take in some of Faversham's gorgeous countryside?

**Start: Ospringe Road/Lower Road**

#### Ospringe Road

The walk starts at the junction of Lower Road and Ospringe Road. Turn right out of Lower Road onto Ospringe Road, towards London Road/A2. Turn right onto Ospringe Street/A2 at the The Ship Inn, and immediately turn left at the Maison Dieu into Water Lane. If you have time, it is worth exploring The Maison Dieu. This 13th century wayside hospital, was a favourite stopover for pilgrims to Canterbury.

#### Water Lane

Continue along Water Lane, past Mutton Lane and Vicarage Lane to reach St Peter and St Paul's Church.

If you want to extend your walk further, continue past the church, along Water Lane until you cross the bridge over the M2 Motorway. Walk along into the village of Painters Forstal until you find a footpath on your left. This will lead you to Lorenden Park, which is certainly worth exploring.

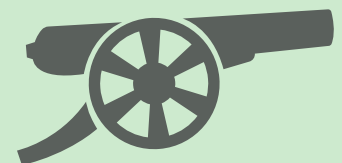
From Ospringe Church, you can now retrace your steps back to Ospringe Road, turning right onto Cambridge Road, left into St Ann's Road to pick up the circular walk.

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## Other places to visit from the Faversham Monopoly Board

### A Day at Belmont

Have you ever visited one of Kent's most gorgeous, hidden gems?

Belmont stands alone as a place to spend the day, where you can wander the gardens, which are open all year through, including Bank Holidays, from 10am.

From the A251, you will reach Badlesmere, where you will turn right and head towards Belmont.

Discover an area of outer Faversham that you may have never previously seen, and take a house tour, or head to the Tack Room to find maps and information.

### Walk Rushmere

Rushmere Farm is a Grade II listed building in Stalisfield in Faversham. Why not explore the area using a range of walking routes?

You can visit Rushmere by parking at Longbeech Woods and making your way through the North Woods before heading out onto the Faversham Road.

Once there, head for Almshouse Road (northbound) and past Rushmere.

Keep heading north, and take a right turn onto Housefield Road, before lopping right back down to the Faversham Road, where you will find the woods (and your car!) again.
