Monopoly Walk Option 2: The Water Walk

Distance: 1.35km (0.8 miles)

Start: Whitstable Road/Abbey Fields

Sewage Works

'Many house, flat or building in Faversham town, Are connected by pipes dug deep underground.'

Surrounded by outstanding countryside to the north of Faversham and home to a huge variety of wildlife, is the sewage works.

The walk starts at the junction of Whitstable Road and Abbey Fields. Walk up Abbey Fields, past Cole Road on your right. Continue along this route until the road splits, take the right road then left to stay on Abbey Fields. Continue along this road, taking in the lovely country views.

You may notice some sheds and outbuildings on your left, this is Faversham's last link to it's gunpowder heritage. This unassuming spot is what remains of "The Abbey Works". The site was opened in 1924 to manufacture specialist mining explosives, the Cardox System. Cardox International Ltd, is still in operation today, working from this site.

Continue along Abbey Fields until the road ends at the rear of the sewage works.

From here you have a choice, turn back and re-join the main circular walk, or you can leave the main walk and opt to return to Abbey Street via Faversham Creek. To do this simply take the track on the right. This is a very pretty walk that will take you across one of Faversham Creek's tributaries and will bring you out onto Faversham Creek. Turn left to follow the footpath back through Iron Wharf boatyard, past Oyster Bay House and along to Standard Quay where you will find a lovely selection of shops and places to eat and drink, including Harley Bear's Coco Bites, one of our official sponsors!
